Situation on Lesbos

Around 8,500 people are stuck...

At the moment around 6,700 people reside in Moria, around 1,200 live in Kara Tepe. Approximately around 600 live in other accommodation facilities. This makes a total of 8,500 human beings, stuck on the island.

The majority is from Syria (34%), Afghanistan (21%) and Iraq (20%). Around 32% are children.

New regulations

On the 17th of April it was announced that the highest Greek constitutional court classified the geographical restrictions as against the constitution. With this it was announced as well, that the new arrivals would be able to move around the country from now on. It was said directly that this would affect only the new arrivals and not the people stuck on the island sometimes since years. Soon afterwards the Asylum Offices of Greece announced that these new hopes are not going to happen at the moment. New arrivals will get the geographical restriction as well.

Attacks on Sappho Square

On the evening of the 22nd of April peacefully protesting refugees were attacked by right wing fascists and hooligans on the main square in Mytilini. The group of refugees was squatting on the square since the 17th of April to protest against the living conditions in Moria and the geographical restriction imposed on them. After a military parade on Sunday evening, which is held every Sunday on the Square, the refugees were attacked for hours with fireworks, Bengalis, bottles and stones. Bottles, filled with gasoline, were thrown into the middle of the group of refugees, where the women and children stayed. People screamed: "Burn them alive!". The police was present during hours, trying to keep the attackers on distance but being way to reluctant. In the end of
